The Benedictus

The Canticle of Zechariah, father of John the Baptist, is taken from Luke's Gospel (Luke 1:68-79) It is sung daily at Morning Prayer.

In the house of David his servant,

As he promised by the lips of holy men,

Those who were his prophets from of old.

that free from fear, and saved from the hands of our foes,

we might serve him in holiness and justice

Order of Mass



Introduction rites

As the Priest greets us, we respond:

Priest: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen

Priest: The Lord be with you.

People: And with your spirit.

Penitential Rite:

We say this together after thinking about what wrongs we have done.

I confess to almighty God
and to you, my brothers and sisters,
that I have greatly sinned,
in my thoughts and in my words,
in what I have done,
and in what I have failed to do,
through my fault, through my fault,
through my most grievous fault;
therefore I ask blessed Mary, ever
Virgin.
all the Angels and Saints,
and you, my brothers and sisters,
to pray for me to the Lord our God.



Gloria

We sing or say the Gloria to praise God. (except during Advent or Lent)

Glory to God in the highest,

and on earth peace to people of goodwill.
we praise you
we bless you
we adore you,
we glorify you,
we give you thanks for your great glory,
Lord God, heavenly King,
O God, almighty Father,

Lord, Jesus Christ, only Begotten Son,
Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father
you take away the sins of the world,
have mercy on us;
you take away the sins of the world,
receive our prayer;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father,
have mercy on us.

For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are Lord,
you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the Glory of God the Father.
Amen.

Liturgy of the Word.

Most of the time there will be a first reading from the Old Testament and second reading from the New Testament.

The reader ends by saying:
The word of the Lord

We answer:

Thanks be to God

The Gospel

We stand up to greet the Gospel.

Priest: The Lord be with you.

People: And with your spirit

Priest: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to (Matthew, Mark, Luke or John, the four evangelists)

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

We make a cross on our head, lips and heart with our right thumb to remind us to think about the Gospel, speak about it and carry it in our hearts.

After the Gospel reading:

Priest: The Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

(no gestures)

Apostles Creed

This is a summary of our Christian faith. When we recite the Creed, we express our belief in a shared common faith.

I believe in God,

the Father almighty,

Creator of heaven and earth,

and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the Virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried;

he descended into hell;

on the third day he rose again from the dead;

he ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty;
from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and life everlasting. Amen.

The presentation of the Gifts:

Priest: Blessed are you Lord, God of all
creation. Through your goodness
we have this bread to offer, which
earth has given and human hands
have made. It will become for us
the bread of life.

People: Blessed are you Lord.

Invitation to prayer:

*The Priest invited us to pray to God
to accept our gifts.*

Priest: Pray, brethren, that my sacrifice
and yours may be acceptable to
God, the almighty Father.

People: May the Lord accept the sacrifice
at your hands for the praise and
glory of his name, for our good and
the good of all his church.

*We praise and thank God
for all the beauty in our lives.*

Priest: The Lord be with you.

People: And with your spirit.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

People: We will lift them up to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our
God.

People: It is right and just.

After further prayers we all sing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

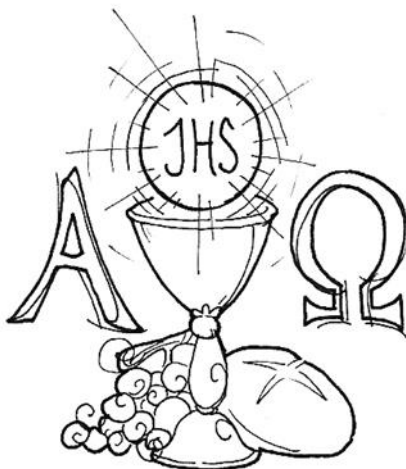
